SKILLS TO SUPPORT LEARNING

The skills we will be focusing on:

- separating happily from family members
- listen and join in with refrains and repeated language in stories
- clap rhythms in words and phrases and listening to the initial sound in words (especially the first initial of our name)
- following instructions
- asking and answer questions
- retelling stories and create our own
- sniping with scissors – using thumb and first two fingers
- holding pens and pencils with thumb and first two fingers to make shapes, lines and to trace letters in our names
